

When World Change Outgrows Funding

HCC's fiscal year ended May 31 with a flurry of fundraising campaigns and wonderful response from our donors. A special thank you to all who responded to the needs of our 4th quarter. You have generously brought in more support in the final month of the fiscal year than ever before, and many lapsed donors have come back to support the mission. As we celebrate this display of support, I must also face the reality that HCC has grown faster than I have been able to keep up with as the primary fundraiser. In the past 5 years, we have increased our weekly staff hours from 114 to 250. You have bore much fruit in supporting our staff, yet the additional fruit has a financial cost. Our total annual expense has increased \$170,000 in the past 5 years with 73% of our entire budget being my dear staff. To avoid a deficit, I face the reality of cutting staff hours and some programming for the 2019-20 fiscal year. Your support is more important than ever to help us be fully staffed to help you fully reach the nations here in our own backyard.
